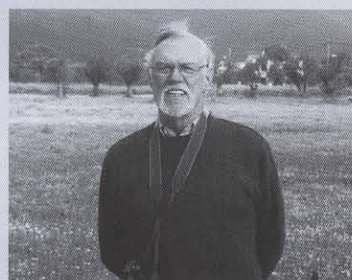
A Financial Plan for Today and Tomorrow

Remembering Oscar and Ella Hansen



Seven years ago,

Oscar and Ella Hansen's attorney suggested that they speak with a financial planner as they reviewed their estate plan. As a result, Monroe "Roey" Diefendorf, Jr., ChFC, CFP, RFC, CIMA, CSDWP, recommended that the Hansens, a childless couple in their 80s, create a charitable remainder trust. The Hansens, who have always valued Christian education, designated The Stony Brook School as the trust's charitable beneficiary, expressing their desire that the trust ultimately provide financial aid scholarships for deserving students. Creating a charitable remainder trust allowed the Hansens to increase their total annual income, decrease their estate and capital gains taxes to zero, and eliminate income taxes for five years. Ella Hansen passed away in December 2005, and Oscar died in September 2007. As a result of their careful planning, the **Hansen Endowed Scholarship for Dedication and Service** has been established at The Stony Brook School as a reminder of the generosity, hard work, and goodwill of a wonderful couple.
