THOMAS V.H. VAIL '44

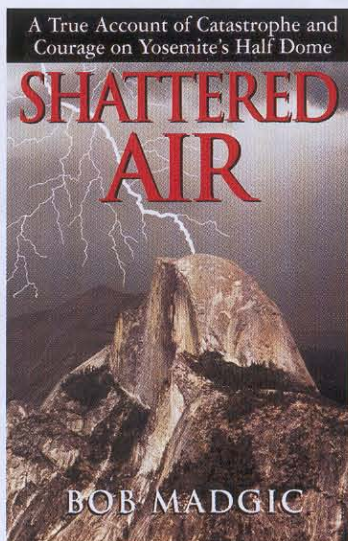

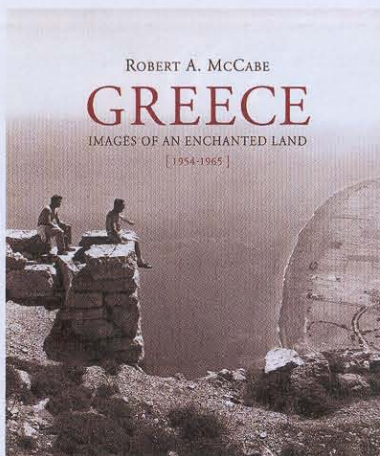
3 Dimensional Wealth: A Radically Sane Perspective on Wealth Management
